In the absence of Director, the day to day affairs was managed by Consul (Cul). Initiative taken to organise regular weekly Sanskrit classes at the ICC. Took initiative to commence regular lecture series on Vedas from August 2018. Efforts made to get the participation of TIC at the International Preventive Health Forum being organised by the State of Sao Paulo in November 2018 as well as possible participation in the Peace Week followed by the State of Sao Paulo in September 2018. Efforts are being made to get a senior official from the AYUSH Ministry to visit Sao Paulo in November 2018 and take the opportunity for the officials participation in the Preventive Health Forum. The visit is being organised through the support of the Future Vision Institute, an NGO actively engaged in the promotion of Ayurveda and Mind Body Healing with the support of the University of Sao Paulo Medical School and intend to sign a tripartite agreement. Efforts are also being made to organise Ayurveda lecture by two visiting doctors from Pune at the SVCC in early September. Support also extended to the Indian Association to organise Independence Day event in August and Onam Festival at the SVCC in September 2018, among others.
